Learn with Leaders: Python, Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) Bootcamp. On Zoom over two weekends in May 2025. You do not require any prior coding/Python experience and will be mentored by a current Harvard undergrad to learn and develop knowledge in concepts and coding. For high

The Telegraph's Newsroom Work Experience Programme. A two-week placement (14-25 April 2025) where you will gain hands-on experience alongside award-winning journalists in a fast-paced newsroom. The programme is based in London (Victoria) and they will help cover the costs of travel, food and accommodation (if required). The Yale Young Global Scholars (YYGS) Programme. This is a summer academic enrichment and leadership programme that brings together outstanding high school students from around the world for intensive two-week sessions on Yale's campus in New Haven.
